MODULE VIII Extrajudicial and judicial protection **16:15 – 17:45**

Objectives: the module will focus on extrajudicial and judicial remedies to resolve disputes related to possible

violations in the processing of personal data.

In particular, priority will be given to:

- Remedies, liability and penalties
- Right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority
- Right to an effective judicial remedy against a supervisory authority
- Right to an effective judicial remedy against a controller or processor
- Representation of data subjects
- Suspension of proceedings
- Right to compensation and liability
- **Penalties**

Expected results: knowledge of out-of-court and judicial dispute resolution tools.
